It reveals the Christian and Muslim teachings on attitudes to suffering, crime, punishment and forgiveness.</p>	<p><b>CHRISTIAN BELIEFS</b> This unit includes study of the nature of God including God as the Trinity.  The key beliefs and teachings about Jesus.</p>	<p><b>CHRISTIAN PRACTICES</b> This unit explores the relationship between God and Christians through practical expressions of faith such as rites of passage and festivals.</p>	<p><b>ISSUES OF RELATIONSHIPS</b> This theme explores the changing nature and the role of the family life in Britain. Changing attitudes to marriage and cohabitation and differing attitudes to sexual relationships. This is studied through Christian and Muslim teachings.</p>	<p><b>ISSUES OF HUMAN RIGHTS</b> This theme explores issues of human rights and social issues. Pupils will investigate moral issues and religious beliefs concerning practices to promote human rights, prejudice and discrimination, wealth and poverty. The religions studied are Christianity and Islam.</p>	<b>REVISION</b>
